	challenges—look to God's Word to find and claim His promises.
3.	"God's plans are never dependent on one man alone. When a Moses dies, God has a ready" (SDA Bible
	Commentary, Vol. 2, pg. 175).
4.	Joshua is called to be and courageous because God is with him and promised not to leave or forsake him
	(Joshua 1:5, 9).
5.	"God calls Joshua to unreserved commitment to His will as the basis for true success and in his spiritual
	warfare" (Richard Davidson, In the Footsteps of Joshua, pg. 41).
6.	"The path of obedience is the path. There is always a bypath to the right, and one to the left; both are
	undoubtedly wrong. A person may go to extremes on either side of the pathway of duty. The evil one is as content for
	a Christian to take the right-hand path of fanaticism as the left-hand path of liberalism. Both lead to destruction" (SDA
	Bible Commentary, Vol. 2, pg. 177).
7.	"What was Joshua's victory? Thou shalt upon the Word of God day and night. The word of the Lord came
	to Joshua just before he passed over Jordan [Joshua 1:7, 8 quoted.] This was the secret of Joshua's victory. He
	made God his Guide" (SDA Bible Commentary, Ellen G. White comments, Vol. 2, pg. 993).
8.	"The Hebrew word for 'meditate' used in Joshua 1:8 literally means 'to give forth' We get a word picture
	of pouring over God's Word until the sighs of contentment begin to spontaneously come forth: 'Ah!' 'Wow!'"
	(Davidson, pg. 43).
9.	This "implies the of Scripture so that we can constantly ruminate upon it like a cow chews its cud—
	digesting, then bringing it up to chew on again. The clause 'this Book of the Law' shall not depart out of your mouth'
	recalls this word picture of ruminating, which literally means 'chewing the cud'" (Davidson, pg. 43).
10.	"The mere hearing of sermons Sabbath after Sabbath, the reading of the Bible through and through, or the explanation
	of it verse by verse, will not benefit us or those who hear us, unless we bring the truths of the Bible into our individual
	experience. The understanding, the will, the affections, must be yielded to the control of the word of God. Then
	through the work of the Holy Spirit the precepts of the word will become the principles of the life.
	"As you ask the Lord to help you, honor your Saviour by believing that you do receive His blessing. All, all
